School Practicalities



However you choose to have your child at school, the school day begins at 8 am with registration every weekday but learners usually come in between 6:30am and 7:30am. If children arrive late they must in the office in advance. Learners should try to be punctual.

• Morning Session: 8 am - 10 am

• Break Time: 10 am - 11 am

• Afternoon Session: 2 pm - 3pm



Please do not pick up your children from the classrooms. If they are not on school transport they will be available at the foodcourt for pickup.

- Playgroup PP1 children are picked up from their classroom from 1pm
- Grade 7 classes end at 3:30pm

If your child is to be picked up by a different person, you must inform the school office in good time. Please do not be late for collection unless unavoidably delayed; this can cause distress.



You are asked not to take your children on holiday during school term.

Requests for leave of absence for medical appointments should be directed in writing/email to the principal and respective deputy for a leave out sheet.

All other requests for extraordinary leave of absence should be directed to the Principal in good time and in writing/email.

It is essential for the school to have accurate information concerning the whereabouts of learners at all times. If you have to collect your child early, for whatever reason, you should liaise with the School Office and class teacher.



All children are provided with a tasty and nutritious breakfast and lunch at school. The weekly menu is available on request and posted in the school's notice board. Please ensure that you have filled in and returned a form giving information about allergies.

It is a school rule that children should not bring any food to school except on permitted special occasions. They may bring water bottles from home. Under no circumstances should hot drinks, juice, sweets or chewing gum be brought to school.

Children may bring individual cup cakes into school for their birthday which is shared amongst his/her classmates at break time.

The cake must be handed into the School Office. The cake must not contain nuts or traces of nuts.



When a child misbehaves and/or breaks a school rule, an encouraging and corrective word from the teacher will achieve the desired result. There needs to be a clearly understood and consistently applied system for use when inappropriate behaviour is in obvious breach of the accepted code. More serious misdemeanours may, in extreme cases, lead to suspension or even expulsion.



Children should never have money at school. The school Mpesa number can be used to pay school trips. Charity money or any other fund should be handed to the class teacher.

Mobile phones and are not allowed at school. To support a particular lessons, learners may occasionally be allowed to bring an electronic device such as a laptop or tablet, to school. Students should label and give any electronic devices they bring to school to their class teacher or admin for safekeeping. Smartwatches/Fitbits are permitted, but the school will not be held responsible for their loss.



Inter-House events take place during the course of the school year, enabling each house to earn additional points, medals, and trophies. Every child is in a house and compete against each other.

Any medication brought to school must be taken in to the School Nurse before 7.50 a.m. A 'Permission to Medicate' form must be completed.

Please also notify your child's class teacher about any medications via the Homework Diary. Children will not be given medications without the permission of their parents.

Following the administration of any significant treatment, the nurse will complete, sign, and send home a Medical Incident Form. An additional insurance charge is included in school fees to ensure that, in the event of a medical emergency, a fully-equipped ambulance service is available.

When the school hosts a sports tournament, an ambulance is always on standby.

If your child is ill, please do not send them to school.



A School Learner Council exists to give children a voice within the school community and to increase awareness and understanding of our place in the world. We have four councils offices that are involved in various aspects of school life.

As with any family, it is critical to establish clear boundaries to ensure a safe and supportive environment that promotes respect for self and others, as well as for teaching and learning.

Our school community, which includes parents, students, teachers, administration, and support staff, must work together to promote and encourage the following values:

- Pupils are expected to attend all classes, arrive on time and actively engage in learning tasks.
- All pupils will demonstrate good citizenship and accept responsibility for their actions.
- Teachers represent authority at school, just as parents do at home.



Lost items found at school are collected and put into the containers outside the Nurse's room. To help ensure they are returned to their rightful owners, we ask that all clothing and personal items be clearly labelled before being brought in. It is also important to claim lost property as soon as possible. At the end of each term, any remaining unnamed items are donated to charity via the PTA-run second-hand shop. More valuable items (e.g. watches) should be handed into the School Office and class Senators sort through all the lost property.
